 - 3. Expose youth to the NCSGC objectives by teaching Jr. Gardeners and sending students to Camp.
- B. To protect civic beauty.
 - 4. Put the FLORAL back into Floral City by community gardening, roadclean up, planting of trees.

C. To advance the fine art of Landscape Design.

5. Encourage residents to improve their landscapes by publicizing our Annual Yard Of The Year Award and by maintaining community gardens.

- 6. Encourage by placing designs in the Library, offering a series of Design Workshops and demonstrating floral designs at Heritage Days and at Annual Plant Sale.
- E. To advance the study of Horticulture.
 - 7. Plant of the Month. Grow and Share Table and tour local gardens.

- F. To advance the fine art of gardening.
 - 8. Encourage gardening among the members and the public by visiting local gardens, developing community gardens, GROW & SHARE: seeds, cuttings and plants and by annual plant sale. Continuing projects.

 - 9. Support the County's Project Pride, continue to develop plans for plantings in downtown area on Trail and at Hwy 41 & 48 intersection.

GUIDELINES FOR USE OF THE COMMUNITY BUILDING

- Keys for the building are at the back door of Vivian Higginbotham's house, 8690 Old Floral City Rd. When finished at the building, lock all doors and the locks on the ramps.
- Furnish trash bags and remove all trash. Furnish toilet paper and paper towels for the Rest Rooms.
- 3. Arrange tables and chairs for the meeting and return to the original position after use. Sweep floor. Lift tables to move; pushing and pulling causes the tables to fall apart.
- 4. Turn on and adjust the Air and Heat as appropriate. Turn off after use. Controls are at the Breaker Box. Lights are located inside the front door and to the left. Turn off ALL lights when finished at the building.



A good bird house should:

- 1 Have ventilation holes under roof overhang.
- 2. Have dramage holes.
- Have clears or be roughened with a wood chisel beneath the entrance hole to help birds climb out.
- 4. Be built for a definite species; proper entrance size and cavity depth very important.
- Have roof extending over all sections for maximum protection.

BY-LAWS AS AMENDED IN MAY 1989 AND MAY 1991

ARTICLE 1. NAME:

The Name of this organization shall be "The Floral Garden Club"

ARTICLE 2. **OBJECT:**

The Object of this organization shall be for the personal enjoyment and cultural advancement in Floral Arrangement, Home Gardening, and Protection and Conservation of Natural Resources.

ARTICLE 3. MEMBERSHIP:
No one shall be acceptable to Membership who does not promise to obey its laws and take an active part in the Club, except those requesting an in-active Membership. Membership is confirmed after three (3) consecutive meetings attended by the new member and upon payment of dues and receipt of a copy of the By-Laws.

ARTICLE 4. DUES:
Annual Dues shall be Seven Dollars (\$7.00) PAYABLE AT THE APRIL MEETING, delinquent June 1st. Any Member whose dues have lapsed over one year, or refusing to contribute to activities of the Club, except those who request In-Active status, (In-Active status members shall pay Ten Dollars (\$10.00) annual dues) shall automatically be dropped from the roll, on a motion of the proper official of the Board.

ARTICLE 5. MEETINGS:

Regular Meetings of the Club shall be held on the SECOND FRIDAY of each month, except for the months of June, July and August. Meeting date may be changed by a two-thirds vote of the members. All regular meetings of the Club will be held at the Community Hall, Floral City, unless otherwise stated in the Program

ARTICLE 5. Continued:

Year Book. Guests may be invited to attend regular meetings. Meeting time shall be 1:30 pm unless otherwise stated in Program Year Book. Members shall act as Chairman and Hostesses when so indicated in Program Year Book.

ARTICLE 6. OFFICERS:

Officers of this Club shall be President, 1st Vice President, 2nd Vice President, Recording Secretary, and Treasurer, and elected every two (2) years. All Officers shall be nominated by a Committee appointed by the President in January. New slate of Officers to be presented at the March Meeting, and elected by two-thirds vote of active membership present. New officers shall assume their respective duties at the close of the final (May) meeting of the year. President: Shall preside over all meetings and decide all parliamentary questions, approve all payments of funds from the Treasury and appoint all Special Committees.

1st Vice President: Shall assume the duties of the President in the absence or disability of the President. Also has charge of appointing Hospitality Committees for each month of the comming year.

2nd Vice President: Shall serve as Program Chairman, and be in charge of the Program Year Book, Executive Board to serve as her Committee, plus any other members directly concerned.

Recording Secretary: Shall keep a roll of Club Members and Minutes of the Meetings

Treasurer: Shall keep a complete record and itemized account of all monies received and disbursed, and present a report at each meeting, or when deemed necessary by the Present or Executive Board.

Other Members of the Board appointed by the President are:

snapshots or suitable pictures to compile a scrapbook of activities of interest of the Club.

bibrarian: Shall keep a list of all books or materials of the Club and Club Members. Must be able to locate such books or material at any time.

Corresponding Secretary: Shall be responsible for any necessary correspondence.

Publicity Chairman: Shall see that the Club meetings and activities are published monthly in all area newspapers.

Advisor: To be voted on by the Executive Board, for a term of no more than two (2) years and eligible for re-election.

Standing Committees: Other Standing Committees shall be appointed by the President as needed.

ARTICLE 7. QUORUM: a minimum of 10 active A Quorum shall consist of two thirds of the members membership. No important business shall be transacted without a quorum. 2 of whom must be elected of licers.

ARTICLE 8. AMENDMENTS:

Amendments to the By-Laws may be made at any regular meeting by a two-thirds vote of active members present. Proposed Amendments to be submitted to the Club one month prior to being voted on.

ARTICLE 9. UNEXPIRED TERM:

The President may fill any vacancy of an officer for the balance of the unexpired term.
