OBJECTIVES OF THE NATIONAL GARDEN CLUB, INC. (NGC)

FLORAL CITY GARDEN CLUB GOALS

A. Aid in the protection and conservation of natural resources



1. FCGC provides each new member with conservascaping and xeriscaping information distributed by the Cooperative Extension Service. Our Wildflower and Native Plants committee offers catalogs and support for members desiring to incorporate such plantings in their landscapes.



2. Suggestions and reminders for the three R's of recycling - Reduce, Reuse, Recycle - are included in the monthly gardening guides provided to members at each meeting.



3. The FCGC Junior Gardeners program encourages participants to think about and practice caring for our environment. Each year two or three Junior Gardeners receive scholarships from FCGC to attend Camp Wekiva.

B. Protect civic beauty



4. Members take pride in helping our town reflect it's name, working hard to keep the "floral" in Floral City through downtown roadside plantings, potted plants outside businesses, the Bird and Butterfly Garden along the bicycle trail, and the Memorial Garden outside the library.

C. Advance the fine art of landscape design



5. The annual awards for Most Improved Landscaping, Sustainable Landscaping, Creative Design and Yard of the Year encourage members to explore and incorporate landscape design techniques in their gardening.

D. Advance the fine art of floral design



6. Membership involvement in preparation and presentation of the Standard Home Flower Show held in March 2000 truly advanced the understanding and education of members and the community about the art of floral design. On-going support of this goal is achieved as members create and explain floral design arrangements they bring to meetings for monthly fundraiser and through attendance to other local and state garden club flower shows.

E. Advance the study of Horticulture



7. An annual scholarship is awarded to a high school senior or college student majoring in some aspect of horticulture. Monthly programs often focus on plant specific (orchids, roses, gourds) horticulture or more general information related to propagation, pruning, pest management, etc. Our Grow and Share program gives members/guests an opportunity to offer information along with cuttings, seeds, bulbs, tubers they bring for free exchange. A monthly handout with tips for the month is provided at each meeting.



PROJECTS

ON-GOING PROJECTS

- **Camp Wekiva/Junior Gardeners:** FCGC has continued to sponsor children to Camp Wekiva since 1982. In 1988, FCGC began a Junior Gardeners after school group to teach them to appreciate and cultivate our natural resources as well as a practical appreciation of gardening techniques.
- **Memorial Gardens ~ Community Building ~ Library:** FCGC began development of the Memorial Gardens in 1992 and dedicated it to the community on October 27, 1996. Throughout the year designated members maintain hedges, lawns & flowerbeds and during the summer other members volunteer to participate in the watering schedule.
- **Adopt-A-Highway:** In the fall of 1989 FCGC adopted a 2-mile stretch of highway 48 as a club project during Citrus County's Project Pride. Throughout the year, four or more highway clean-up days are held ... Garden Club members and others in the community participate.
- **Heritage Days:** Since it's inception in December 1992, FCGC has been supporting Heritage Council's Heritage Days. Each year Garden Club members volunteer to dress up in period costumes to Hostess the Tour of Homes in various historic homes throughout the city. In addition, members bake cakes and cookies for the cakewalk and/or cookie sale to raise funds for the club and to make a donation to the Heritage Council.
- **Decorate the Town:** Each December FCGC gathers to make Christmas decorations and place them throughout the business district and along the "Avenue of Oaks".
- **Arbor Day:** Each January FCGC members join together in this annual celebration to plant a native tree on the Withlacoochee State Rails-to-Trails and/or maintain the trees planted by the Club along the Avenue of Oaks.
- **Annual Plant Sale:** Each spring FCGC hosts a plant sale for the community and schedules guest speakers throughout the day to teach everyone about Florida gardening topics [individual plant species, garden pest/weed control, proper pruning and fertilization techniques].
- **Withlacoochee Trail State Park Butterfly Garden:** Throughout the year FCGC volunteers maintain a butterfly garden that we established on the Withlacoochee Rails to Trails, complete with bird feeder and birdbath.

NEW PROJECTS

- **Scholarship Fund:** In keeping with National, Regional, State and local Garden Club goals for support of education in the fields of botany, agriculture, horticulture and conservation, the FCGC has established a scholarship fund to be awarded annually to a Citrus County student planning to major in one of these fields. The first annual scholarship in the amount of \$500 was awarded on

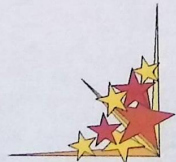
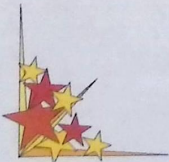
September 26, 2001 to John Andrew Korycki, a CFCC student, who has also been involved in FCGC as groundskeeper for the Memorial Garden for the last 4 years.


- **Memorial Tree Campaign:** Floral City is widely known for its "Avenue of Oaks", a half-mile long stretch of century old live oak trees, originally planted in 1884, which canopy the historic district along Orange Avenue. In order to preserve this heritage of our community, the FCGC is embarking on a campaign to have each existing tree carefully evaluated by a Certified Arborist and to replace trees, which have been lost due to disease or storms over the years. Individuals and community businesses will be given opportunity to purchase a sizeable tree in honor or in memory of a designated person or organization. FCGC will coordinate publicity, solicitation for donors, the selection and planting of trees. Plaques will be placed to identify the donors and honorees.
- **Memorial Gardens Signage & Statuary:** The FCGC will supplement a memorial donation received from the daughter of Mary Prichard, to purchase statuary for the garden as well as replacement signage describing the labyrinth and a new sign to identify for the public that the Memorial Garden is a project of the FCGC.

COMPLETED PROJECTS

- **Flower Show, Garden Tea & Fair:** The entire club was involved in monthly workshops to learn how to make flower arrangements, grow specimen plants and put on a flower show. In the spring of 2001 we sponsored the Floral City Standard Home Flower Show with Garden Tea & Fair using the theme "A Peek At Our Past". [2001]
- **Memorial Gardens Restoration Project:** The plants in the Memorial Gardens, which were damaged during a building-repainting project, so were replaced to return the gardens to its original beauty. New benches were installed to provide safe seating to garden visitors to stop and rest in the shade. A new sidewalk replaced the stepping stone path to make the gardens more accessible and safe for visitors to enter. [2000]
- **Plant the Town Project:** The garden club participated in a community-wide project digging new gardens, making planters and planting plants to put "floral" back into Floral City. New gardens were created at the corner of Old Floral City Rd. & Orange Avenue, the Lighthouse, the Shamrock and under the Old Oak Tree between the Masonic Lodge and Memorial Gardens. [1999]
- **Junior Gardeners Wildflower & Butterfly Garden:** We helped the Junior Gardeners at Floral City Elementary School to make a Wildflower Butterfly Garden. [1999]
- **Avenue of Oaks Tree Replacement Project:** Beginning with Citrus County's Project Pride in 1990 and over the next several years, FCGC volunteers planted 50 live oak trees provided by the county along the "Avenue of Oaks". In hopes that the live oaks will grow up and eventually replace older trees that die or become damaged.
- **Welcome Spring Project:** In 1991 FCGC volunteers planted Dogwood seedlings purchased from the Inverness Garden Club between the Live Oaks along the "Avenue of Oaks" to "Welcome Spring".


- **Withlacochee Trail State Park Beautification Project at Jeanette Gazebo Site:** For Floral City Heritage Council's Gazebo Project, FCGC members, assisted by a few volunteers from Heritage Council, planted 18 trees [10-65 gal size], 25 vines and 10 shrubs [all native] along the Withlacochee Trail State Park. April 1997.
- **Community Building Beautification Project:** FCGC members planted and maintained hedges & flower gardens in front of the Floral City Community Building from 1991 until 1998 when the Lions Club assumed responsibility.
- **Post Office Beautification Project:** In 1989 FCGC members planted flowering plants and shrubs at the Floral City Post Office. In 1990, on 20th anniversary of Earth Day, FCGC members replanted the gardens and continued to maintain them until 1997 when the P.O. assumed responsibility.



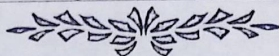


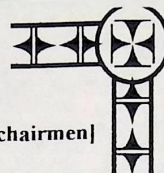
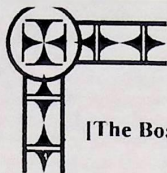

| ARTICLE 1 | NAME: The name of this organization shall be: "Floral City Garden Club" |
| ARTICLE 2 | OBJECT: The object of this organization shall be for the personal enjoyment and cultural advancement in Floral Arrangement, Home Gardening, and Protection and Conservation of Natural Resources. |
| ARTICLE 3 | MEMBERSHIP: No one shall be acceptable to Membership who does not promise to obey its laws and take an active part in the Club, except those requesting an in-active membership. Membership is confirmed after one meeting attended by the new member and upon payment of dues and receipt of a copy of the by-laws. |
| ARTICLE 4 | DUES: The annual club year shall be 1 June through 31 May. The annual ACTIVE membership dues shall be \$12.50 [husband and wife dues \$13.50]. The annual IN-ACTIVE membership dues shall be \$15.50 [husband and wife dues \$16.50]. Members joining between January 1 and May 31 will pay half the annual dues. Annual dues are payable January prior to the 1 June club year. A member will be dropped from the role when dues are not paid by the time the Treasurer sends Club dues to State in May. ACTIVE members are those who attend meetings and contribute to the activities of the club. IN-ACTIVE members are those who are unable to attend meetings and/or are unable to contribute to the activities of the club |
| ARTICLE 5 | MEETINGS: Regular meetings of the Club shall be held on the SECOND FRIDAY of each month, except for the months of June, July and August. Meeting date may be changed by a two-thirds vote of the members. All regular meetings of the Club will be held at the Community Hall, Floral City, unless otherwise stated in the Program Yearbook. Guests may be invited to attend regular meetings. Meeting time shall be 1:00 PM unless otherwise stated in the Program Yearbook. |
| ARTICLE 6 | OFFICERS: Officers of this club shall be President, 1 st Vice President, 2 nd Vice President, Recording Secretary and Treasurer. Officers shall be elected every two- [2] years. A Committee appointed by the President in January shall nominate all officers. New slate of Officers to be presented at the March Meeting, and elected by two-thirds vote of active membership present. New officers shall assume their respective duties at the close of the final [May] meeting of the year. <i>[See duties of Officers]</i> |

| ARTICLE 9 | UNEXPIRED TERM: The President may fill the vacancy of any officer for the balance of the unexpired term |







WAYS AND MEANS

In addition to an item purchased from the Ways and Means fund, *members are invited to bring a rooted plant, a useful gardening tool or gardening related craft to donate for the monthly drawing.* Proceeds from ticket sales are used to support club "reaching out to others" projects, such as the Scholarship Fund.



GROW AND SHARE TABLE

For each regular meeting, a table is set up for *members to bring cuttings, seeds, bulbs or tubers to share with others.* Members are asked to write down general information about the plants they bring to share.



ADOPT-A-HIGHWAY

Four times a year *members meet* at the Floral City Community Building for bags, pick-sticks, brightly colored vests and road section assignments for trash pick-up along the 2-mile stretch of highway which we adopted as a club project from U.S. 41 east on CR 48 to Trail's End Road.



MEMORIAL AND BUTTERFLY GARDEN WORKDAYS

Two or three times a year, workdays are scheduled for *members to assist* with in-depth maintenance and re-planting of these Garden Club projects. Additionally, during summer drought months, individual members sign up to do weekly watering.

HERITAGE DAYS



The first week-end of December each year the Floral City Heritage Council presents Heritage Days. *Garden Club members participate* by decorating the downtown area and "Avenue of Oaks", assisting with luminaries, serving as hostesses in the historic homes, and organizing cookie sales or a cake walk.



COMMUNITY EDUCATION

Each Spring, along with the annual Plant Sale, the club hosts a free lecture presented by an individual with expert knowledge in some area of horticulture, often a local Master Gardener.



Procedures for Honoring Deceased Members



Background: The Floral City Community Memorial Garden was established in 1993 and dedicated in 1996 for the initial purpose of honoring deceased Garden Club members. The Purpose soon expanded to include honoring all members of the Floral City Community and their loved ones.

Memorial Book Pages: There are three categories of pages for the Memorial Book:

1. "In Memory of": full page is used for donations of \$100.00 or more in memory of a deceased individual and the multiple listing page for donations of less than \$100.00.
2. "In Honor of": full page is used for donations of \$100.00 or more to honor a living individual and the multiple listing page for donations of less than \$100.00.
3. "A Special Gift": full page is used for general donations for the Garden of \$100.00 or more and a multiple listing page is used for donations of less than \$100.00.

Categories:

1. Active/inactive member in good standing.
2. Past member who was a charter member or who served the Club well for a long time.
3. Past member of the Club.
4. Spouse, parent, sibling or child of a current member.

Procedures: It will be understood that when a funeral or service is held locally, the family will approve Club activities either directly or through the funeral home.

Active/Inactive [current] member in good standing:

1. Their name will be placed in the Memorial Book on a full "In Memory Of" page noting their date of birth and death and years of membership along with membership status [active, inactive, life member].
2. If a funeral/memorial service is held locally, Garden Club members attending the service will:
 - a. Sign the register as a Club member
 - b. Sit together
 - c. If approved, the Garden Club's "Floral Watercolor" will be placed with the other flower arrangements for viewing during the service and picked up at a later time.
 - d. This will consist of Club members going into the service as a group and individually placing a flower in the designated vase, then sitting together. Upon completion of the service, the flowers will remain unless there will be a graveside service. Each member will remove a flower from the vase

and take them to the graveside and place it on the casket at the end of the graveside service.

Past Member who was a **CHARTER** member or who served actively for a lengthy period of time but who, due to illness or other extenuating reasons was unable to hold current membership:

1. Honored with a separate "In Memory of" page in the Memorial Book.
2. If funeral/memorial service is held locally, Club members attending the service will:
 - a. Sign the register as a Club member
 - b. Sit together
 - c. If appropriate, the Club's "Floral Watercolor" may be used by the funeral home,
 - d. If appropriate, the Club's "Flower Procession" will be used.
3. A Certificate will be given to the next of kin noting inclusion of the deceased in the Memorial Book and that the donation is accepted in memory of the deceased.

Past Member of the Club: A certificate will be sent to the next of kin informing them that the name of the past member will be placed in the Memorial Book on a page containing the names of other past members.

Spouse / Parent / Sibling / Child of a current member:

1. The Club member will be sent a certificate of notification that the name of the member's loved one will be placed in the Memorial Book on a page designated for this purpose.
2. Memorials will be accepted and recorded in the Memorial Book.
3. If funeral/memorial service is held locally, Club members attending the service will:
 - a. Sign the register as a Club member
 - b. Sit together
 - c. If appropriate, for active spouses of a Club member, the Club's "Floral Watercolor" may be placed at the service.
 - d. If appropriate, the "Flower Procession" may be used for a spouse who was active in the Club.

East Citrus County Gardening Guide for mid September - October

| | |
|---|---|
| <p>Annuals</p>  | <p>Plant cool season annuals such as, Pansies, Calendula, Shasta daisy, Snapdragon, Statice and etc. where they will receive 6-8 hours of sun, in soil with a pH of about 6.5, amended with lots of compost. Water daily for a week or two then only when the top inch feels dry to the touch. Fertilize every 2-3 weeks with a liquid 20-20-20 or every month with a dry 6-6-6 or slow-release fertilizer.</p> |
| <p>Perennials</p>  | <p>Sept. Divide tuberous or bulb plants that bloom in the spring: daylilies, amaryllis, African iris, and calla and Easter lilies.</p> |
| <p>Lawns</p>  | <p>Don't fertilize after mid-September. Continue to mow and irrigate as needed. St. Augustine and Bahai:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Grass should be kept at least 3 ½ - 4 inches high. ➤ Always mow with a sharp blade and never mow too close ... it will inhibit root growth and development. ➤ Leave your clippings ... they supplement fertilization when they decay. <p>Rye Grass: If you want to keep mowing throughout the winter, sow 7-10 lbs of annual rye grass seed per 1000 sq. ft. late in the October.</p> |
| <p>Trees & Shrubs</p>  | <p>Sept: Fertilize non-flowering shrubs growing away from lawns [those in/near lawns receive nutrients from lawn fertilizer]. Fertilize Azaleas [do not prune after September] and Camellias. Oct: Transplant trees and shrubs you wish to move to a new spot. Citrus: You can now start decreasing the watering frequency.</p> |
| <p>Vegetables</p>  | <p>Plant cool season vegetables such as: Beets, Broccoli, Cabbage, Carrots, Chinese Cabbage, Collards, Endive, Kohlrabi, Lettuce, Mustard, Bulb Onions, Bunch Onions, Parsley, English Peas, Radish, Spinach, Strawberry and Turnips</p> |
| <p>Weeds & Pests</p>  | <p>Fire ants: Learn to recognize their mounds: Sprawling mounds with multiple entrances and coarse texture of mounds [especially in sandy soil]. Chemical control:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Amdro & other baits that target the queen [follow mfg. Instructions] <p>Biological control:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Boiling water applied directly to the mound works if it reaches the brood chamber ➤ Note: Grits don't work, but they will cause the ants to move elsewhere. |
| <p>Miscellaneous Odds 'n Ends</p> | <p>Review your strategy for cold protection of tender garden plants ... this is a good time to order any supplies you may need.</p> |
| <p>Tips</p> | <p>Propagation: A convenient way to propagate cuttings is to use a small piece of floral oasis foam. Soak it and place it in a saucer of water containing root stimulant ["Root Tone" & "QuickStart" are good ones]. After the cuttings root, you can place the cutting with the foam in the pot with soil. Note: Plants started this time of year will need protection from the cold by placing in a greenhouse or indoors throughout the winter. Don't plant new cuttings in the garden until spring ... they won't have enough time to become established</p> |

| <p>Annuals</p>  | <p>Bulbs: If you want blooming plants inside during late winter or early spring, buy bulbs [Oct/Nov] and begin the chilling period. Hyacinths, daffodils, tulips, crocus, can be forced to bloom the first year are "annuals" in Florida. Paperwhites are better suited to our climate and will bloom again. Protection: protect your cool season annuals from a hard freeze.</p> |
| <p>Perennials</p>  | <p>Potted plants: bring them indoors, but first give them a good inspection: . Critters: invert the plant and remove the pot ... remove critters. It's a good time to re-pot plants that are overly root-bound and trim off any damaged or rotting roots. When repotting, use a pot that's one size larger than the pot it has been in. Wash "used" pots, in a mild solution of bleach. . Fungus: on a few leaves, pick them off, spray the plant with a fungicide and isolate it from other plants. Discard severely infected plants.</p> |
| <p>Lawns</p>  | <p>Don't fertilize. If we don't get about 1" of rain, water every 10-14 days.</p> |
| <p>Trees & Shrubs</p>  | <p>Transplant: move small trees or shrubs that aren't happy where they're planted. Water/Fertilize: REDUCE watering and STOP fertilizing plants that go dormant or rest [slow down] during the winter months. Leaves: recycle > mulch, compost, or use around the base of tender plants/shrubs / trees for cold protection. When it warms up, move the leaves away from the stem / trunk to prevent damage or kill the plant / shrub / tree.</p> |
| <p>Vegetables</p>  | <p>Monitor for insects and disease, water, and fertilize [as needed]. You can still plant vegetables [beets, broccoli, cabbage, carrots, Chinese cabbage, collards, kohlrabi, mustard, onions, radish & spinach. Garlic grows well in cool/cold weather ... cut the tops for salads [Garlic chives].</p> |
| <p>Weeds & Pests</p>  | <p>Spider mites thrive during the dry season. Adult mites normally have eight legs, no antennae or wings, and are so small it's difficult to see without a hand lens. Pesticides that can assist in mite control with minimal damage to natural enemies are: insecticidal soap, sulfur, horticultural oil, and selective miticides like dicofol (Kelthane). Caution: follow label instructions.</p> |
| <p>Miscellaneous Odds 'n Ends</p> | <p>Be ready for cold protection of tender garden plants ... it's not the norm, but we have had killing freezes in November.</p> |
| <p>Tips</p> | <p>Tools: Winter is the perfect time to sharpen, clean up and condition your gardening tools and equipment.</p> |
|  | <p>Gardening with native plants: Blue Curls {<i>Trichostema dichotomum</i>}. Family: Mint {Lamiaceae}. Blooms continuously summer>fall in 1/2" bluish purple flowers with a white dotted lower lip and 4 long curled stamens. Habitat: Dry pinelands & thickets in full to part sun throughout the state. Comment: This deciduous, woody 32" tall, & 32" wide plant makes a great small shrub. A hybrid variety with 2" flowers may be found in some nurseries</p> |
