FEBRUARY MINUTES

Lynn Bassett gave the recommendations for the slate of Officers for the next term. They are Lona Bassett, President, Anne Propp, First Vice President, Sandy Van Tassell, Second Vice President, Laura Lee Pdtzback, Recording Secretary, Donna Thomas, Treasurer, and Mary Lou Eaton, Corresponding Secretary. It was moved that the slate be accepted and it was voted in. President Bassett mentioned using the Birthday money for the Butterfly and Rose Garden needs.

The Plant Sale Chairs mentioned several actions that are being taken to prepare for the sale; some trips to dig up native plants, meetings to plan the decorations and staging for the sale and some trips to purchase plants for the sale. Discussion about having seeds available for the sale and/or for club members went on with final plans to be given later. Members are encouraged to let Jan know what kind of seeds that we have available and she'll post the names on the

web site. The Plant Sale Committee also would like to know what homegrown plants will be available for the sale.

The Spring/Summer Luncheon will be held on April 24, at the Inverness Country Club and the cost will be \$17.36 each. Please get this payment to Donna as soon as possible along with the choice of chicken or London broil.

Strawberry Festival participation was discussed. Diane Little and Mary Lou Easton will be some of the people who will be at the Hospitality Tent showing a wreath and/or plants that visitors might buy at our upcoming Plant Sale.

Volunteers are needed for this event. The club needs a representative to attend the FCMA meetings on the 3rd Monday from 6-7PM.

Mary Lou Eaton says that the Junior Gardener project is on hold for the time being.

A discussion about having or not having the pots of plants beside the vet's office on Orange Avenue was held. Susie Metcalfe and Amber Persyn have worked on the tubing for the pots and until a firm decision is made the pots will remain. The Historic Transportation Corridor committee and Keep Citrus Beautiful are looking into the overall "look" of the roads and roadsides so we will get and give input to them.

In lieu of several committee reports Susie Metcalfe gave a report about Simplicity and Variety in Landscape Design. She showed photos of yards from simple to high variety.

Landscape Design Chair, Mary Lou Eaton, spoke about what the committee is working on right now. One item is the Garden Awards. A second is the Butterfly Garden Project which has begun with meetings with the State Maintenance Coordinator and a survey of the existing garden. The committee was given \$100 from the Trail to purchase plants.

Field trips to see well designed gardens are other projects that the committee would like to continue. Suggestions are appreciated. Days preferred seem to be Thursdays or Saturdays.

Garden assessment is another ongoing project that the committee is working on. More information will be determined later.

The Petal Power award was given by Joan Knippen to Susie Metcalfe for her many good works for the club such as her presentation, filling in whenever needed for many jobs and for chairing the Roadside Cleanup Committee.

April 18-20, 2015—the dates for the FFGC State Convention and members were encouraged to go. The District V meeting will be April 30, in Brockville at the Southern Hills Country Club.

The next board meeting will be Thursday, February 26, 2015, at 9:30AM at the home of the President.

In Other Business there will be a short Safety Talk before the March 2 Roadside Cleanup beginning at the Duval Island Boat Ramp Parking Lot.

Diane Little showed club members the finished product from the demonstration of crafts that she and Joan Knippen did at last month's meeting. Some will be available for sale.

Several Citrus County garden clubs' various fund raisers were mentioned for members to consider attending.

Marcia Beasley presented President Lona with the beautiful floral design that she had created as decoration for the Social Time in recognition of her 50th wedding anniversary that day.

MARCH, 2015, MINUTES FOR THE FLORAL CITY GARDEN CLUB

Dara Reppe and her daughter showed members and guests how the system of vertical gardening with drip feeding and watering can produce easy to pick vegetables without the numerous pests that attack plants that are grown in the ground. We were shown the one stack option for a patio as well as many stacks which could yield enough food or flowers for a large family. Several members evinced interest in growing plants in this manner and asked questions to further their knowledge.

After the speaker and a short break when the numbers were drawn for the Door Prizes
President Lona called the business meeting to order at 1:25PM. The Invocation was given by
Marcia Beasley and the Pledge of Allegiance and Club Collect were led by the President.
District V Director, Sandra Messer, and her sister were introduced as well as other guests.
The Secretary checked member attendance and there were 26 present for the business
meeting.

President Lona gave Birthday Good Wishes and Thank Yous to the Hostesses and Greeters as well as reminding the Clean Up crew for the end of the meeting.

The minutes of the February meeting were approved as sent out electronically. Donna Thomas, Treasurer, gave the report with the beginning balance being \$4,561.19 and the ending balance being \$4,823.48. At this time the club is under budget by \$55.92.

For the Horticulture report Lynn Bassett had a flip chart to write members' tips for easy gardening and mentioned coleus as the plant of the month and showed members the root of the Florida betony that can be eaten.

Mary Lou Eaton, Landscape Design Chair, talked about the Butterfly and Rose garden possible merger, the Yard of the Year Awards and the Field Trip to the Spring Hill Gardens to be taken on April 25.

Shiela Finch created a Bonsai from just a potted plant to a finished product giving members a running commentary while she was working. The completed Bonsai was given to our District Director who spoke to us about her activities while being director and encouraging members to attend the FFGC state convention as well as the District V Spring Meeting which will be held in Brooksville.

The next board meeting will be held on Thursday, March 26, at 9:30 AM at the home of the President.

Mary Lou Eaton, Landscape Design Chair, left a written report mentioning that the committee is in the process of evaluating yards for the Awards to be given in May. The April 25 trip to the Spring Hill Garden had to be cancelled for lack of interest.

Donna Thomas did the Floral Design for the month in a very short time. She filled a martini glass with water, added a beautiful floating dahlia blossom with two hanging pieces of mint for a lovely fast arrangement. The Petal Power Award was postponed.

The President reminded members of the State Convention and the District V meeting. The State Convention will be April 18-20 and the District Meeting will be on April 30.

The next Board meeting will be held on April 24, at 10:30 AM at the Inverness Country Club before the luncheon.
