In the late 1990s when the Floral City Heritage Council designed and constructed the Gazebo across Orange Avenue form the Trailside Garden, the Floral City Garden Club recommended the native plants for the site and planted all of the trees and shrubs one sees there today.

A good time to visit the Gazebo Site, the Trailside Butterfly Garden and the Community Memorial Garden in the Town Center would be between 12:45 and 3 p.m. Monday, May 30, when the Lion's Club will sponsor a cook-out and band at the Town Center following the Herbert Surber Post 225.
